




David Bowie

The man, the legacy. David Bowie.

The tributes and the Brixton street party in honour of him are amazing.

He continued progressing with the times constantly and still to his last days left the world with music, and the fact that it is cool to be different and unique.

(Oh and just to clarify, David Zowie is very much alive!)

To commemorate the life and works of David Bowie (8 January 1947 – 10 January 2016), music licensing company PPL has released an official chart of the Most Played David Bowie Tracks of the 21st Century.

Aggregated using PPL's exclusive UK airplay data, the chart collates those Bowie tracks which have

been played in public and broadcast on TV and radio since the year 2000.

Let's Dance, David Bowie's 1983 release, produced by Nile Rogers, tops the chart. Timeless classics also features in the top twenty PPL Most Played David Bowie Tracks of the 21st Century chart include, Under Pressure (Bowie's hit duet with British rock band Oueen) at number two, and Starman (the inaugural story of persona Ziggy Stardust), at number three.

David Bowie's top 20 most played tracks span three decades of recordings with the earliest. Space Oddity, released in 1969, appearing in the chartai number seven, and Absolute Beginners, released in 1986, at number 19.

Over the course of the 21st Century, David Bowie received over 360 million seconds of radio and TV airplay in the UK.

I first came across your name after hearing yout fantastic track 'R.E. D.M'. I found it to be a cross between House with the chopped | always loved 1980's music, but vocals, Future House with the baseline and Synthwave 80's with the chords and synths.. Could you tell us how the track was made and your thought process that went into it?

started this track upon realization I had while studying some modern EDM tracks, that they were focused on the bassline instead of a traditional lead melody. In fact the very bass was also the lead melody. So after I came across the bass notes for the track I began building it centered How long have you been around it. I wanted to revive the

vibes of early-90's Stadium House music, the feeling you have when you're in a warehouse party circa 1993, washed over by green laser lights and surrounded by glow sticks and pink-haired girls.

How would you describe your sound?

As modern dance music heavily inspired from the past. I take everything associated with the extravagant music of the 80's and early 90's and merge it with a modern beat.

When did you first realise you had a passion for retro and 80's sounding music?

began making music like that only two years ago. The first tracks were written for my personal pleasure, having fun with my friends about how much retro-sounding I could go. At some point, and while I discovered that others were doing a that kind of music too, I began taking it more seriously and worked on many tracks intensely up to the point Future 80's Records found me on Soundcloud.
