All she said was she was told by Grun's father never to sell the house and to give him the key.

Grun: (thinking to himself)

Dad told me to contact Kyle Simonson. I can't see how that would help me. Things have changed and my only hope is to find out where the relic is and get in there in invisibility mode.

Grun is now getting an inner message from his father to buy the paper and to scan the announcements. He would have to risk coming out of invisibility mode. He walked around the back of the shop and scanned the area and then he pressed the coin to reappear. He then walked around to the front and walked inside. Grun picks up the newspaper from the rack and goes to the counter.

Shop assistant Janet :(looks at Grun and shouts)

Hey, you are the guy in the papers.

Grun looks around for an escape but the door is blocked with two men who hear the assistant shout. Grun runs into the back of the shop looking for the back door; Grun finds it but it is locked. The manager has now blocked the way back so all Grun can do is run into the storeroom; he locks it behind him. He scans the area but there is no escape. All he can do is climb up onto the shelving and lie low. He rips the announcement page out of the paper and puts it in his pocket he doesn't have room for the rest of the paper so he throws it out of the window. It doesn't take long for the police to arrive.

Grun (thinking to himself)

Why didn't dad know about this? Is all this some sort of test for me? Am I dad's special envoy on Earth? Why do I always have to take the crappy end of whatever I come up against?

Grun receives an inner message from his father... because you are learning and learning to be proficient in the right way is not easy, just rest in meditation, it won't take long for the police to go.

Detective sergeant Watkins: (looking around the storeroom)

Are you sure he came into this room?

Manager:

Yes, he must be in there, there is no other exit.

Detective sergeant Watkins:

Look for yourself; there is only the toilet over there and it has only a very small window and bars on it. The other window has bars too.

Manager:

I can't understand it; the only place he could hide is behind the coat rack and on the shelving.

Grun: (keeps very still as they look directly at him.)

Detective sergeant Watkins:

Well, there is no one here.

A police constable arrives and says I found this newspaper outside the storeroom window, sir. Manager:

Yes, that is the paper he took.

Detective sergeant Watkins:

I'll take that

Grun is now wishing he had hidden the paper better. The police will find out he ripped the announcement page out and maybe they will be able to decode whatever the message is. Grun realizes that being proficient is not easy as his dad said. All Grun could do now was lie low and rest. At five o clock the shops workers were getting ready to leave. The police had gone but Grun knew there was still an officer posted outside. He knew also that detective sergeant Watkins was a person who believed in mysticism and would be able to understand partly what Grun was trying to do. Grun also knew that Inspector Mac nee was taking leave on health grounds; he was no fool and knew there was not going to be a happy ending.

The workers came in to get their coats.

Shop assistant Janet : (looking around)

Manager:

Janet:

Manager: (laughing)

Janet

It's no joke, I'm frightened. I feel dizzy being here.

Manager:

Don't be daft, Janet, You'll feel different tomorrow.

Janet:

That's another thing, I'll be taking a few days off, Ian; I need to get away for a while.

Manager;

What? Why didn't you tell me before?

Janet:

I'm telling you now, in fact, you can call this my last day, I'm resigning.

Manager;

Well thanks a lot you bloody little swine.

Janet; (looks around the room and shudders)

Let me out, I feel ill.

Manager: (follows her out and leaves the door open)

Be reasonable, I can't get anyone to fill in for you so soon.

Grun makes his way to the door and looks around. He quickly walks to the main shop front and stands near the door waiting for Janet to go. Grun can see the officer stood outside looking around.

Janet:

Hurry up and get my wages, I want to go. Never mind I will collect...no, you can bring them or send them.

Manager;

Janet, please be reasonable.

Janet: (pushes by him and feels she is going to be ill.

Manager: (grabs her arm and turns her round)

Janet, please...

Janet: (looks at him and then vomits over his shirt and trousers)

Manager:

You bloody little cow.

Janet:

Stuff you, I'm off.

Janet opens the door and walks out. Grun walks out after her making sure he doesn't step in the vomit while the manager is stood still in a pool of sick. Grun then quietly walks out of the town center and towards his house. He looks back to see the police officer smiling to himself at the manager's predicament.

Scene Fourteen: Grun's house

Grun reaches home and can see the cordon around it plus police at the front gate. He can also see the dragon which is moving around the house in a snakelike manner inside the circle. It is fully alert and ready to strike. He walks around to the back and sees another officer stationed at the gate near the hedge. Grun walks towards the back door. The dragon sees him and stops in front of the door. Grun feels scared but knows he is protected. Grun takes out the dragon coin and holds it up. The dragon moves back and Grun walks to the door and then looks around, he waits till the officer is not looking and then he quickly moves inside the house. He goes up to his bedroom and takes out the mirror from behind the bookcase. He realizes that he didn't need to hide it as the police couldn't get in the house, but it is human nature and what people do. They want to make sure that everything in life is protected. Grun now knows that in this physical world everything is liable to be lost, stolen, broken, or will someday die. He puts the mirror back on the wall and meditates in front of it. He can't put the light on, not because the police will see it but because they have turned off the power. He then realizes that the phone is about to ring; two seconds later it rings and he knows it is the police, he ignores it. Grun knows it is not yet time to talk with his father so he goes over to his bed and sits down. He takes out the paper from his pocket and scans it. He sees one announcement that grabs his interest; it is in a code that he invented at school. He realizes that only he and Kyle knew about it; Kyle was very good at making and using codes also. It was worded in a way to make it seem as though it was an ordinary letter but certain words were used to mask the first ones. It was from Kyle and he wanted to meet up with Grun. He lay down to sleep secure in the knowledge that he was safe.

Grun's father:

Grun:

Grun:

Grun's father:

I feel unsure of where my life is leading me. All I want is to be at peace.

Grun's father:

You will feel different after the initiation; you know there is no need to look into the mirror now as you will receive whatever you need through dreams. Tell me now, do you want it?

Grun;

Yes.

Scene Fifteen: House of fire

Grun is now awake and knows that the S.A.S is going to storm his house at 4.30 in the morning. It is now 3.30 and everything is quiet. The house is illuminated by a series of searchlights. Marksmen are in place and Grun had to be careful of not going near the windows, not because he might be hit but because he knew that whoever shot at the house would be killed as the bullet would rebound back. Grun wished he could tell the authorities about the dragon but knew that he could not. The responsibility was not his; it was his father who brought the dragon here and not Grun. All he could do was let karma take effect. Grun decided to meditate for a while but as he was starting to get deeper into it he was brought back with a jolt as he heard a scream at the rear of the house. He didn't need to look out as he knew what had happened. A reporter had taken it upon himself to try and get into the house. The dragon had hit him with fire. He is rolling about on the floor and the police are now on the spot. The reporter is inside the invisible line and the police are deciding whether to risk pulling him back. They decided to risk it and the dragon strikes again. Two policemen are blown clear of the garden and are on fire. The reporter is now dead and the other policeman ran for his life. Grun felt sick and weary.

The S.A.S is now at the local airfield and getting ready to board the large helicopter which would bring them to their fate. They would have done all the usual preparations and scanned the house and grounds, but in vain. The helicopter approaches the house; it has a big metal ram hanging underneath, when it is released it will smash through the roof allowing the team to abseil down and enter the roof to throw in the grenades.

Chief Constable:

What about the photos? What do they show?

Chief Superintendent Barton:

It is unbelievable, sir, they didn't come out.

Chief Constable:

What? How many people were photographing it?

Chief Superintendent Barton:

Perhaps inspector Jackson can explain it better, sir.

Inspector Jackson;

There were six official people recording the event for us, sir, not one of them has any trace of photos or recordings. We can't understand it.

Chief Constable:

This is ridiculous!

(An officer appears at the door and says, the home secretary's on the phone, sir)

Chief Constable:

Oh, no. OK, I want some answers; I am not satisfied with this. Chief Superintendent Barton, lock the area down. I will be back later.

(The chief Constable leaves the room)

Chief Superintendent Barton:

What do you make of this, inspector?

Inspector Jackson:

Everyone who saw the event says that the metal ram rebounded upwards as it was about to hit the roof.

Chief Superintendent Barton:

But that's impossible; it defies the law of gravity.

Inspector Jackson:

Nevertheless, that is what happened. I saw it with my own eyes.

Chief Superintendent Barton:

The press is having a field day. They say we can't even get into one house.

Scene Seventeen: Army H.Q

Lieutenant Colonel Roberts: (Airborne Assault Group)

We have been asked to help with the perplexing problem that the police and Special Forces have been having lately. The house in question is for some reason able to withstand being forcible entered. I want some suggestions.

Captain Bridge:

Could we not try an anti-tank weapon, sir?

Lieutenant Colonel Roberts:

Yes, that seems to be the first option. It would be quick and easy to use. Another option would be to tunnel underneath and plant an explosive device there. I'll get in touch with the engineers later.

Major Elliot:

The news says that the house has always been prone to some sort of witchcraft, sir.

Lieutenant Colonel Roberts:

The press, as you know, will print anything. All I want is down to earth ideas. The S.A.S was unlucky, that's all. We will avenge them, and bring out that Magnusson person, if he is there.

Major Elliot:

Scene Eighteen: Home

He decided to leave the house and meet up with Kyle in the morning. But how would he spend the night? He wasn't too bothered about that, but he had to get away. He pressed the coin to make himself invisible then

Grun: (thinking to himself)

Scene Nineteen: Daily Record Newspaper Office

Editor Ellis:

What did you find out about the chap who was killed in the Magnusson garden? Reporter Winfield:

Not much, they won't release any info. Johnson was there and says the guy was shot! Editor Ellis:

That means this Magnusson person has a gun!

Reporter Winfield:

But how could he see the guy in the hedge, he would need a rifle with night sight and everything that goes with it.

Editor Ellis:

He must have them. The word is they are bringing in the Army!

Reporter Winfield:

The whole thing is utterly fantastic. Newspaper people from all over the world are coming here. It's going to be bigger than the Iranian Embassy siege.

Editor Ellis:

Much bigger, at least they got into that place. Tim, I want you to take Aston, Scott, Henry and Jacobs. Set up a shift system, get as near to the house as you can.

Reporter Winfield:

What about the danger from Magnusson?

Editor Ellis:

If he can hit a person behind a hedge in full darkness then he can distinguish between soldiers and reporters. We can't rely on the cameras so all we can do is actually see what is happening. Ashton and Scott are artists, yes, so they can draw the scenes.

Reporter Winfield:

That's another thing how in hell can a house affect our cameras?

A worker comes to the door and says, funny things are happening at the Magnusson house, Chief, a dog and two cats have been burned to a crisp and also birds are falling from the sky on fire when they fly over it, but no one has any photos.

Editor Ellis:

Tim, get over there with your team. Hurry!

Scene Twenty: Grun's Bedroom

Grun is now in depression. He knew that the dragon had increased in power and ferocity.

The dog's cats and birds that were killed would normally have been spared. For some reason the dragon is starting to exert itself. Grun would have to ask his father what to do. The problem now though is how to get out of the house to meet Kyle. He wished he had left earlier. There would be marksmen covering each window with high powered rifles. He would have to open the window to get out and they would see that and if they fired upon it they would get killed. He wished he had left the window open before but like his dad said learning to be proficient isn't easy. The only other option would be to phone the police and tell them he was coming out and then walk out in invisibility mode.

Grun: (on the phone)

I want to speak to someone in charge of the Magnusson case.

Detective sergeant Watkins:

Yes, how can I help you?

Grun:

I am Grun Magnusson, I want to come out.

Detective sergeant Watkins:

OK, just give me a few minutes to get authorization and I will phone you back.

Grun's phone rings.

Chief Superintendent Barton:

Is this Grun Magnusson?

Grun:

Yes, I want to come out.

Chief Superintendent Barton:

Alright, I will set it up. Tell me exactly what time you will come out and what door you will use.

Grun:

I will use the front door at twelve noon today.

Chief Superintendent Barton:

Very well, we will be there. Make very sure you don't have anything on you which could be seen as a weapon.

Grun:

You are referring to the man who got killed in the hedge; I have to say it wasn't me who did it.

Chief Superintendent Barton:

That will be decided later. Make sure you come out with your hands on your head and when you get down the steps take another three steps and then lie down on your stomach.

Grun

OK. (Grun puts the phone down)

The time is now eleven o clock. He had to meet Kyle at two o clock. Grun hears a loud crack and knows that a hedgehog has come too close to the invisible line and has been burned.

The dragon is becoming uncontrollable. Grun dreads to think what will happen later. He sits down to meditate. He finds himself in a temple standing inside a circle of druids. The Elder Druid walks up to Grun and tells him that his father has now been excommunicated. Grun feels sick.

Grun:

Why didn't you stop him before he brought the dragon?

Elder:

We didn't know. Your father had gained powers which were unknown at the time. He had gained access to one key, but as you know, he could not acquire the other. You have been contracted to get it. It is now in the vault at the British Library in London. Find out through your friend Kyle Simonson when it will be taken out and where it will be taken.

Grun:

How can I be expected to get away with this? I amonly just starting to get the needed powers at this time.

Elder:

No, you are a past master, and have been for a very long time. I have to give you the higher initiation now. You have by passed many initiations over the last few days. Please believe in yourself.

Grun: (becomes conscious)

The time is now nearly twelve o clock. Grun focuses his mind on the present time and walks to the door; the time is now twelve o clock. Grun presses the coin to become invisible. He opens the door but doesn't walk out. Grun decides to wait. Chief Superintendent Barton comes over the loudspeaker.

Chief Superintendent Barton:

Come out with your hands on your head.

Grun waits for another few minutes.

Chief Superintendent Barton:

Mr. Magnusson, if you don't come out you will force us to open fire. We have an anti-tank gun here and it will blow the side of the house down.

Grun: (shouts)

I will come out in a few minutes; I have to use the toilet. I have to tell you that if you use that weapon you will get hurt, be warned.

Grun then walks out of the door quietly and tip toes down the steps and walks up the path to the gate, he ducks under the police line and looks around to see many people farther up the road behind a police cordon. There are many newspaper people and reporters from all over the world. Grun has to make up his mind which part of the cordon to get through. He decides to climb over the Nichol's garden fence through to the back and over the wall and through to the main road. Grun would meet Kyle at the canal crossing in the woods where they use to meet as kids.

Scene Twenty One: House

Chief Superintendent Barton had now to make a decision. The time had elapsed for Grun to come out of the toilet and there is no response from him. He is now talking with Lieutenant Colonel Roberts.

Chief Superintendent Barton:

He must be in there but there is no response.

Lieutenant Colonel Roberts:

He has had ample time to comply. I feel he is planning something. I think we should use the weapon.

Chief Superintendent Barton:

OK. I will radio in that I am handing over the matter to you.

Lieutenant Colonel Roberts:

Very well, Sergeant Major Higgins, prepare the eighty four millimeter for use.

Sergeant Major Higgins:

Very well, sir, Corporal Jones, stand by to fire.

Corporal Jones:

OK, sir, right, Clarke and Smith load and wait for the word.

Lieutenant Colonel Roberts:

Magnusson, I am giving you just five minutes to come out, we are preparing the anti-tank weapon for use.

The Colonel and Chief Superintendent Barton together with several other people are stood to the left of the anti-tank weapon and behind a wooden barricade which is at the side of the house. He is pretty sure Kyle is on the level. He quickly hid behind a tree and pressed the coin then stepped out and walked up to Kyle.

Kyle:

Grun, where did you spring from?

Grun;

You must be getting old; at one time you would have spotted me a hundred yards away.

Kyle:

I know, but I 'm sure you didn't come from up there because I have been looking all the time.

Grun

Just put it down to experience. I have had a lot of training in concealment. Well, how are you? Kyle:

OK. What about you? What's all this about you in the papers?

Grun:

It is mostly to do with my father. Will you believe me when I say that all these deaths are not my fault?

Kyle:

Of course I will, I know you couldn't have possibly have done them. I have been having a series of dreams about you. They say I have to help you.

Grun:

Anna had the same sort of dreams, but she betrayed me.

Kyle

I won't. I have nothing to gain by it and you know I want to be initiated in the dream state.

You must promise me that you will help me. You were always stronger than me but I have to warn you that now I have the protection of the dragon. If you even try to hit me you would be hurt. Is that understood?

Kyle: (looking serious)

Why all the seriousness?

Grun:

This is the most serious thing that I have ever been involved in and you must realize it. Twenty eight people have been killed so far. More will surely follow. I want you to help me steal an Egyptian relic from the British Library.

Kyle:

I didn't know I would be asked to do anything illegal.

Grun:

If we don't acquire the relic then many more people will die.

Kyle

Why don't you go to the authorities and get them to help, I'm sure they will understand.

Grun;

I said that to my dad and he said no. No one must know about the power of the relic key. It doesn't just have the power to stop the dragon: if they don't use it properly it could cause untold damage. The dragon is already growing in power. We don't have a lot of time, will you help me?

Kyle:

Of course, now I know the significance of it all. What do you want me to do?

Grun:

I want you to use your expertise on the pc find out where they are taking the relic. Hack into the library files, I know you can do it.

Kyle:

I'll try but with all this publicity I don't know how long I will last before they catch me.

Grun:

I want you to hold my hand in a certain way for a few seconds in a moment, it will give you protection. I will chant some words and you will repeat them is that understood?

Kyle:

Yes. I feel giddy.

Grun:

That is the power in me starting to affect you. Now, hold my hand with the thumbs touching and repeat after me.

Scene Twenty three: Army HQ

General Taylor:

I want to know exactly what happened.

Colonel Hampson:

It is exactly what happened at the helicopter crash, sir; the weapon rebounded to the original point.

General Taylor:

Then there must be some sort of weapon in the house.

Colonel Hampson:

It is thought, sir, that there is a sort force field around the house.

General Taylor:

We have got to get in there. If there is some sort of force field around the house then we want it to be examined. I have been told to use any and all resources to get in there. Major Park from the Royal Engineers here will tell us what he thinks about tunneling in from below.

Major Park:

Thank you, sir. I believe that if there is a force field around the house then it will not be in operation under the house. A force field of any consequence has not been invented as yet, but we have to look at the recent events. A considerable force is repelling our efforts to enter through the walls.

Colonel Hampson:

Excuse me, Major Park. May I make a suggestion? We don't know exactly how much power it is capable of. We know it can repel an anti-tank gun but how would it stand up to a missile fired from a plane?

General Taylor:

He is sat down on a bench in the town center watching the people hustle here and there. He knows that if someone is attracted to him while he is in this new consciousness, so to speak, then that person could be trusted. After twenty minutes a girl of about twenty five approached him.

She stood staring at him with a look of tenderness. Grun knew her name and just looked at her with a smile

Grun:

May I help you, Peggy?

Peggy:

You know my name! I knew you knew me but I wasn't sure.

Grun

You know me also.

Peggy:

Yes, I do but I can't recollect your name. I am usually good at names.

Grun:

As the fighter flies over the house to lock in the target it starts to have electronic problems. The pilot says he can't see the house on the aircrafts screen; it is blanked out. He asks to abort the mission, the plane is told to return to base but it is now having serious problems. The plane's engines shut down and the pilot tries to use the ejector seat which doesn't work. All he can do is pray as the fighter nosedives into the churches social hall and several rows of shops. The resulting explosion is heard fifty kilometers away. Some people said they could swear that they saw the outline of a giant snakelike creature in the resulting smoke.

Scene Twenty Seven: Army HQ

General Lloyd-Hewitt:

Major Collins:

The pilot could have had a heart attack and would not have been able operate the ejector seat, sir.

General Lloyd-Hewitt:

Yes that is a possibility, but we will never know as there is no trace of his body. Captain Cox, I can see you are on the verge of cutting in here; do you want to contribute something?

Captain Cox (is a woman)

Yes, sir, if I may propose something which will create scorn and laughter in some.

Grun stays at Peggy's for three days. She lives out of town and the setting is peaceful. He needed to rest and meditate away from all the trouble; he knows that two hundred and forty two people were killed at the plane crash and one hundred and seventeen injured. Scene Twenty Nine: Parliament

Home Secretary:

Some people are even saying that there is a mystical snake of some sorts which is causing these unfortunate events. I say we have to be down to earth and put the blame on the Magnusson family; Grunwald Magnusson is a man who is capable of inventing any number of weapons. We have evidence to put forward that he nearly killed three boys with some sort of stun gun when he was only a teenager. He is a very able and cunning person; top of his class in every subject. We have his school record here; Math's, Chemistry, Physics, Science; he was head and shoulders above anyone else, his marks are on par with the best in the world. The trouble is he became a loner and a fanatic. We cannot let this situation go on; he has to be brought to justice. The world's press is saying that we cannot even get into one house. I give way to the honorable gentleman.
