... it is more common among older adults due to the wear and tear on a person's mouth that occurs over the years.




To help you identify the cause of your teeth sensitivity, here are the most common reasons along with the possible treatments that may reduce your pain.

## **COMMON CAUSES**


When you mention that your teeth are sensitive, your dentist will conduct a thorough exam that may reveal one or more of the following causes.









When cavities break through the enamel, the dentin is exposed which allows for the sensations caused by heat or cold to reach the nerves.











Similar to tooth decay, a worn filling or tooth fracture allows cold and heat to reach the dentin.



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
