


REVELATION #2

Thomas Leonard, one of the pioneers in Coaching, started ICF in 1995 as a nonprofit organization for coaches around the world, to support each other and grow the profession.

With the support of volunteers and growing interest, ICF began its efforts to raise the profile of professional coaching.

ICF created Core Competencies and built a Code of Ethics, setting the standard in the coaching field.

An **Ethical Conduct Review Process** and Independent Review Board (IRB) were also established which allows consumers to file breach-of-ethics complaints. ICF's obsession with ethics is one of the things I admire the most about it.

ICF also defined curriculum standards (accreditation) to ensure consistency in coach training, and developed an ICF Credentialing system, requiring renewal every three years. Renewal through CCEU is again one of the best practices...
