



Mou may have heard that words are powerful, words have been likened to an egg, a dagger, a scorpion and I join in the league of those who have described words to say that, "words are the world." Yes, your words are your world.

That is more like a seed, because only seeds enter into the ground and they come back up in a different form.

#### What about faith, what about believing?

To have faith is to speak what you have believed. It is the declaration of an unwavering belief. Have you wondered how our salvation came? It came when we confessed (with our mouth) what we believe<sup>5</sup> (the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ- the savior).


A man demonstrates faith when he speaks what he believes<sup>6</sup>. The Christian is no ordinary person; he must learn to be deliberate about his words, knowing that they have the potential to bring about a manifestation in the physical realm. Now that you know that your words are seeds, you

can create a whole lot of things. We must be careful to make sure that our words align with the intent and purpose of God; by so doing, we will attain greatness. It is not enough to know that death and life are in the power of the tongue<sup>7</sup>, the essence of that is for us to even choose our words correctly at all times. If
