
The Fatherless Nest reigns in our society. By creating mayhem and separating man from God. Far too many fathers are not spiritual men and this must change.

Brazil Ule shouted! "Where is papa, isn't he coming"? "He went out, he will be back later, and when he get's back he will join us" she replied. He had never left Mbola their village in Tanzania since he he came



as an infant. As excited it sounded, deep down inside, he had a feeling his family wan't going to be the same and he wasn't going to see Mbola their small village again. His mother had often said she was leaving. This time he had over heard her making plans on the phone with her cousin in Brazil. She was telling her that she was fed up with Ule's father and she wanted to return to Brazil. His mother was originally from Brazil, that's where she met

Ule's father.



They had gotten married, had Ule and moved to Tanzania when he was five years old. His parents were having problems more often as of late. His mother kept on

saying she was going to leave and go back to Brazil. Tanzania was beautiful but adjusting to the lifestyle was difficult for her. She missed the city life. Ule loved it, the beautiful scenery the animals, it was perfect. A quaint, paradise, quiet green and natural, just the way he liked it.

Tanzania is located in the East of Africa, and had the highest mountain on the conti-

nent, in the northeast of the country. The Kilimanjaro dreaded for it's height and dormant volcanic nature. Mbola was a small hilly town in rural parts of Tanzania in the Uyui district in mid west. Travel to the town was difficult due to it's hilly interior. The nearest city center, was Tabora, and was 36km away 22 miles. The airport was another 100 miles away.

December 10,1985 was a day hatched in Ule's memory. The day his world changed forever. The day his merry hearts was broken. One of the neighbours was already waiting outside to take them to the airport. Almost ten hours drive away from where they lived because of the bad roads. They hurried outside to meet him. "What about papa, mom"? he sobbed! "I want papa. I have to tell him bye and make him pray that we have a safe journey", with tears rolling down his face.

Ule'S NEW LIFE

Ule had never left home without his father praying for him before. "We will stop and see him on the way" she responded without even looking at him. Ule waited and waited throughout the ten hours before getting to the airport, to see his father. They never stopped! He held his head low, the once cheerful face had a lifeless expression. They boarded the plane, Ule said nothing, he never uttered a word. And as the flight sliced through the clouds, Ule closed his eyes and pulled the blanket over his head, pretending he was asleep. Remained in that position for the entire journey. The blanket was dripping with his tears that kept on flowing from his eyes, all the way to Brazil. He remained silent trying to ease the pain, he never said a word he didn't eat anything. Since then he has never been the same.

Separation can be quite traumatizing for a child, even babies. It can lead to disruption in various aspects of a child's developmental stages. This process which usually occurs before the age of three. This includes the bonding process with parents, that

bond that usually happens between a child and the parents is drastically affected. As their is a natural feeling of defrayal and mistrust. Wherein the child may feel rejected and having the feeling of always having to apologize. Fearing that if they did something wrong the parent will abandon them. So they tend to be submissive in search that lost. Separation results in the child becoming distant from the parent and the parent becomes distant from the child. It affects the foundational development of speech. As in delayed language skills that usually starts developing at the age of one. Mobility gets affected, as the child may start walking late. Their physical and social skills gets affected as the child may develop low self esteem, due to feelings of rejection. This results in the child becoming shy around other children and adults. And may not know how to relate to other children. Aggressive and angry easily follows as the child at that age often doesn't know how to manage their emotions. These characteristics are often seen played out in countries where migration is rampant. A few years ago my husband was teaching in a school in the Caribbean. He often had to refer several children to the guidance councilor to seek counseling. As many were from homes that had a similar story to tell. No fathers or even worst both parents were gone and had left the

children at the mercy of other family members. Or sometimes worst, with total strangers. What these children went through was only left to the imagination. However several of these characteristics were displayed in the class. The child would get angry for no apparent reason and start fighting other children, while the lesson was in progress. They would fall asleep and unable to concentrate on the lesson. They would shy away from participating during class time. And overall distract other children and create disruptions. Some even stopped from school completely for various reasons.

It takes a heart transformed by the power of God to first of all notice that this child has a problem and needs help. Without labeling and predetermining that the child will not amount to anything good in this life. Providing support to help the family rebuild a safe, secure and nurturing home will help the recovery process.

Arrival in Brazil

When they landed it seemed like a whole new world to Ule. Brazil was a whole lot different from the village and he had already established that life would never be the same again. Ule was an A student in the primary school he was attending in Tanza-

nia. He had recently started playing football and was always eager to go and play with his friends.

Today in the United States of America, and many other countries around the world. If you are traveling with your child, or children. If they are minors and they are unaccompanied by the other parent. You are required to show a permission note to immigration indicating that you were allowed from the other parent to travel with them.

If you are a single parent, who has the legal and sole custody, of your child. A copy of the court custody document is necessary and can replace the letter from the other parent. Failure to do this can result in major problems.



Many of us grew up in single parents homes, where a father's guidance was absent. While many of us through disobedience neglected the guidance our fathers and went of to sew wild oates. Ule's case was unfortunate and one that was driven by anger and impulsive decisions. It is important that parents thing through situations carefully before making decisions. In the heat of rage a parent may try to get back at their spouse by leaving with the children. In the long run the child is the one who suffers and suffers bitterly.



Ule was nine when he left Mbola. And now five years later he still had not gotten accustomed to eating a western meal of eggs, toast and cereal. He was accustomed to his auntie in the village, picking fresh food from the tree and preparing it for him. Fufu, bitter leaf soup, garri, jallof rice and pap. He now had to adjust to a new lifestyle, he just didn't like it. His mother was always working to ensure they had food on the table., She hardly got the chance to stay home with him. She eventually met someone at work. Ule was angry when she started taking him home. He started staying out late. They got into fre-



quent fusses over trivial things, event though Ule was thought to always respect his parents he was very unhappy with his mothers decision to date someone else. Ule started staying out late. His mother started smelling smoke on his clothes. He would often tell her that he had stopped by his friend's house and they had a barbecue that's why his clothes smelt smokey.

This continued for many months. No one was brave enough or had the time to sit



and find out what was really going on in the young man's life.

In situations like this it takes God's wisdom. In Proverbs 1 that Salomon was concerned about his people and wanted them

to learn how to handle situations in a wise way. So he started teaching them how to solve problems wisely by applying wisdom. The Lord tells us that wisdom is a spirit the only way to get it is to reverence God and to fear Him.

One night Ule had a big fuss with his mother's friend who later drove him out of the house. The boy was just fourteen years old at the time. Still a child with no guid-



ance. His mother didn't say anything. Jeremiah 49:11Leave your fatherless children; I will keep them alive; and let your widows trust in me." If only she had someone to help her and tell her how to handle this crisis. Her son would not have left home and she wasn't a believer.

Ule left the house in a frenzy. That night

he met Janet. He later dropped out of
school. The school tried desperately to get

getting in and out of trouble.

Proverbs 3:11-12 My son, do not despise the Lord's discipline


One generation has to take the responsibility to break the chain and the cycle of Fa-
